Delta Kappa Phi Brothers represented 12% of the total student body in the 1905 - 1906 school year, with 18 active Brothers. Fraternities were seen as both evil and necessary. It was not uncommon for hazing to occur publicly and school supported. In addition to DK, both Phi Psi and Omicron Phi were active fraternities on campus. This is the earliest list of Brothers. It includes Beta # 1 George Boyd. You will notice that Alumni are identified as "honorary Members'.



In 1907 36% of students were in a fraternity.

1/3 of those were Dekes. There were no women enrolled at Lowell Textile. Pawtucket Street had trolley tracks running through it. The school was just one building. DK couldn't figure out what to call those guys that had either graduated or left school, as now they are Associate Members.

Delta Kappa Phi had swollen to 25 active Brothers, almost 19% of the student body. It's clear that with total fraternity membership approaching 50% of enrollment, that Greeks had a major influence over the goings on at campus. On a more curious note, tobacco was not allowed on the school side of the bridge and pipe smoking was not allowed on the streets of Lowell. Controversy was a brewing at Lowell Textile. Fraternities, with their significant numbers were influencing the school at every level. Some folks didn't like it too much; as the editorial below alludes to.



In 1909 Delta Kappa Phi was 20% of the total student body and the dominant house on campus, with 34 Brothers. It appears Trustee election's were being held for the first time, and with Associate/ Honorary/Alumni Brothers representing such a large and active portion of voters, there was angst around who would be elected.

"TO THE ALUMNI:And what of the Fraternity? Are they a menace to the welfare of the school, tending to disintegration? Not necessarily. The proper sphere of the fraternities is social. They are humanizing & delightful when composed of congenial spirits. Here personal life friendships are formed, and as they reach out into numerous chapters they broaden one's acquaintance and become a valuable asset in life...The active influence of your fraternities would be disastrous to the growth and influence of the school, if exerted to magnify the importance of one department at the expense of another, in awarding athletic prizes, in marking standards of scholarship, or in the election of graduate trustees. In the latter case it would be fatal to the further representation in the Board of Trustees."The thought of Dekes running the school terrified administrators. Of course, there would have been no new machine, but likely the largest cold tap system and loudest sound system 1909 ever saw! How about that first paragraph? How true is that to this day.














The 1910s- 1919


The initiation was quite spectacular both on the street and in the classroom, and the "stunts" performed under the shadow of the paddle were interesting and amusing (to all except the Freshmen). The period of torture was brought to a fitting chimax on Friday evening, March 7, at Kerth's Theatre, when the candidates for admission entertained the audience with a program that would shame Shakespeare or Al Jokon. To quote from the Tert of March 13, "It is doubtful if such a combination of finished and internationally known actors have ever been assembled a tone time upon the stage." Nary's song, "The Frish Kaiser," sung (?) to the tune of the "Wearing of the Green", brought forth such a perfect deluge of offerings from orchestra, balcony, and boxes, that he was compelled to withdraw. On May 24, 1919, the Beta Chapter of Delta Kappa Phi closed its school year with a reunion and banquet at the New American House in Boston.
